MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT/CFO

Eastern Canada bore the full brunt of the impact of climate change in 2025, reversing the pattern seen in the previous two years in western Canada.

Atlantic Canada, in particular, saw summer temperatures that were more than ten degrees above normal, shattering temperature records and exceeding 1-in-50 year severe drought conditions. Dozens of forest fires erupted in a region that is typically relatively immune to uncontrolled wildfires.

Our teams at Replant.ca Environmental were faced with extreme challenges this year. Various wildfires pulled our helicopters away from our two national park projects; they were understandably tasked with the critical job of helping to protect lives and property. Other travel logistics were also disrupted.

Our major seedling suppliers faced incredible challenges. We had planned to plant another quarter million trees which had to be deferred until 2026, as the drought conditions stunted the growth of many seedlings at the nurseries, resulting in some needing an additional growing season to reach target vitality specifications before they can be planted safely.

We extend our deep gratitude to our sponsors and partners, and to the hard-working staff at our nursery suppliers, who helped ensure that our 2025 tree planting season didn't need to be cancelled outright.

Looking forward to 2026, our planting program will be significantly larger than in 2025, as we make up for lost time. We're excited to meet the new logistical challenges that will accompany this growth, and to think about the significant positive impact that we'll be able to facilitate, which of course wouldn't be possible without all of the stakeholder support that we're so fortunate to receive.

OUR RESTORATION & CARBON CAPTURE PROJECTS

In 2025, these were our two main restoration project areas:

Timber River – We planted 47,185 trees scattered through a number of large openings within this fifty-hectare forest in southern New Brunswick. These openings were created when Hurricane Fiona hit the region in September of 2022. This project was funded by Forests Canada.

Shemogue – We planted 39,390 trees on this project, building a future forest in southeastern New Brunswick. This region is one of twenty priority areas of ecological significance on the northern shoulder of the sensitive Chignecto Isthmus region. We look forward to permanently protecting this forest in perpetuity. This project was funded by Forests Canada.

OUR PUBLIC PARK PROJECTS

In 2025, we participated in tree planting programs in the following public parks:

Cape Breton Highlands National Park – We planted 217,889 trees in this park in Nova Scotia, working as a supply partner for the Clean NS Foundation and the provincial government's Thriving Forests initiative.

Gros Morne National Park – We planted 300,000 trees in this park in western Newfoundland. This was an especially difficult site, with significant challenges due to the remote access, but the beauty of this region cannot be matched. This project was designed and sponsored by Parks Canada.

Fundy Parkway Provincial Park – In this year's phase of a multi-year project, we planted a total of 90,445 trees. This project was sponsored by Forests Canada.

Herring Cove Provincial Park – We wrapped up a two-year program in this remote provincial park, planting 21,995 trees in this park. This project was sponsored by Forests Canada.

Maқтаquac Provincial Park – We planted 29,435 trees at this site, which is another of our ongoing multi-year projects. One focus for the 2025 planting included reclamation work on the north and east sides of the new lagoon area. This project was sponsored by Forests Canada.

In addition to the locations listed above, we planted another 12,500 trees that were scattered in smaller quantities in other municipal and provincial parks. We also planted another 11,340 trees on small environmental restoration projects for various small landowners which were sponsored by Forests Canada.

We expect to be planting in a number of municipal, provincial, and national parks in 2026, with projects already planned for at least six parks. We're looking forward to it!

Despite the significant challenges due to the heat and drought in Atlantic Canada in the summer of 2025, we had a very satisfying year, almost exceeding our previous record-setting production season.

We want to give a huge thank you to our major sponsors, for whom we acted as a supply partner (especially Parks Canada, the Clean NS Foundation, Nova Scotia's Thriving Forests Initiative, and Forests Canada). We also saw significant support from a wide variety of smaller Canadian businesses and public supporters, which allowed us to act as the lead proponent on various additional projects.

In total, we planted 770,179 trees across our various Canadian projects in 2025, which was an incredible accomplishment in the face of the environmental challenges. We have even more ambitious plans for 2026, with over a million trees in the initial planning stages.
